

# PROFESSIONAL TRAPPING SUPPLIES

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
## COLLAPSIBLE PIGEON TRAP INSTRUCTIONS

The first photo shows the trap.  
The trap will arrive in its folded position with five (5) galvanised steel parts taped together.

Open the trap and push the “L” shaped rod through the loops in the front of the trap door.  
See the photo right.

The second longest rod with an “S” bend on each end is the top support rod. It can be seen attached in the top left hand corner of the photo to the right.

The longest rod with a hook on each end is the base support rod. This rod spans from front to back and is clipped under the trap to form a rigid support.  
The trap is now assembled.




To set the trap for pre feeding the two handle shaped rods (door retainers) can be attached to the inside of the front door as per photo # 2. The photo to the right has been taken from the inside of the trap.

Pre feeding should be carried out for a minimum of seven days and should include fresh food and water every day. If the trap is in the direct sunlight please provide shade of some sort.

During the pre feeding process it is beneficial not to have food outside of the trap. However if you are having difficulty encouraging the birds into the trap a small trail of food leading to the bowl may assist.

After the pre feed is complete remove the door retainers and allow the fingers to fall down. The trap is now set.



The “D” shackle on the top access panel can be removed to allow harvesting.  
Continue feeding and harvesting until no pigeons are entering the cage.  
This can take between one and three days usually.

Repeat the process as often as required.
