RABBIT/POSSUM TRAP RPT260 INSTRUCTIONS

BAITS

For possums use small pieces of fruit, banana unskinned is one of the best, but possums will eat most fruits.


For rodents use bacon rind, a piece of cloth saturated with peanut butter or most types of meat.

Make sure you place bait as far back in the trap as possible to ensure the animal is completely in the trap before reaching the bait.


Lift latch [A] and open door inwards, place suitable bait at rear of trap.

While holding the door open pull forward the trigger bar [B] far enough to hold the door open, place trap in a suitable flat area. The trigger bar sensitivity can be adjusted, it is shipped set for possums or bandicoots, see details below for adjustment for smaller animals.

It is recommended you place a cover over the back of the trap as animals are likely to attempt to get at the bait from the back of the trap and set it off without entering, An old blanket, hessian bag or piece of carpet is ideal. Only cover up to the latch, the cover must not be over the latch bar [A].



RPT210 is set for normal sensitivity with the small groove in the trigger bar to the top. This is the best set for bandicoots etc. When you wish to trap smaller animals or rodents change the trigger bar so the groove on the end of the bar is to the bottom.



To turn the trigger bar to the less sensitive position insert screwdriver and open the hinge. Turn trigger bar over so the small groove is to the bottom and close the loop back up with a pair of pliers.

A good trap is just like your motor car, clean and service it regularly and you will get years of trouble free use, spray your trap with fisho-line after use to prevent corrosion from animal urine and chipped or scratched galvanizing.

Different states have various rules regarding possums, and in some states it is illegal to relocate a possum or native animal more than 35 meters. Please consult with your local authority for wild life laws in your area.
